The Long Range Property Planning Committee spent two years looking at the needs Friends expressed in a questionnaire that was sent to each meeting. When we looked at the needs and at the facilities already available within the yearly meeting, we decided that this booklet would help connect needs with facilities.

There is no facility that will accommodate very large groups, such as the yearly meeting sessions held in July/August, the Women's Retreat held in January, or the Spiritual Formation Program that meets as a whole once in the fall and again in the spring.

The three camp facilities, Catoctin Quaker Camp near Thurmont, MD, Opequon Quaker Camp north of Winchester, VA, and Shiloh Quaker Camp north of Charlottesville, VA, are available during the spring and fall. During the summer, mid June to mid August, they are used by the camping programs.
