The Maryland Restorative Justice Initiative is a four phase initiative. Our mission is to advocate and promote humane and sensible criminal justice and sentencing policies for those incarcerated long term in Maryland prisons. The aims and objectives of our initiative are to advocate for legislation and policies so that individuals who have been incarcerated for many years may receive meaningful consideration for release. We believe that through actions of restoration, redemption and reconciliation, we can create long-term systemic change.

After serving 39 years for a crime he did not commit, and witnessing the dismal conditions of the Maryland Criminal Justice system, Walter Lomax, in conjunction with sponsors, partners, and other concerned organizations, organized a seminar on May 14, 2008, which was Phase I. The goal of the initial seminar was to bring together members from the three branches of Maryland State Government, along with members of Congress, advocates, volunteers, and professionals from various levels of society to establish dialogue around restorative and humane criminal justice policies to address existing problems in the Maryland Criminal Justice system. We held Phase II on September 20, 2008, to register family members and friends for our data base, we hosted Phase III on January 10, 2009, Phase N began with the introduction of SB-900, though SB-900 did not pass, as we move for-ward with the continuation of Phase IV we need your support.
