He is a recorded minister in Northwest Yearly Meeting (NWYM) and a member of North Valley Friends in Newberg, Oregon. Colin and his wife, Janine, are the parents of four grown children. Recently, Colin concluded his work as General Secretary of Friends United Meeting. He served this global community of Quakers since 2011.

Prior to joining the FUM staff, Colin was superintendent of NWYM for over seven years, spent 16 years in pastoral ministry, and ten years as an adjunct professor at George Fox University and Seminary. He has had the privilege of traveling among Friends throughout the US and across the globe. He holds a master's degree in theology/church history from Eastern Mennonite Seminary and a doctoral degree in leadership/spiritual formation from George Fox Seminary.

Parents staff a co-op childcare for rising K to rising 5th from 4-5:20pm, in Smith Lounge immediately following the JYM afternoon program on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. This allows parents to attend interest groups and committee meetings. To take advantage of this co-op, parents *must work one shift*. If you are interested, please "register" your child and sign up for your work shift. You can find the Co-op signup sheets in the afternoon and evening program area.

JYM closing worship: On Saturday, we'll close the JYM morning classes with an all-JYM meeting for worship. If weather permits, we'll be outside in the pergola. Last year we had a lovely Meeting for Worship in that beautiful space. Parents are welcome to join us for worship at 11:30. All children should be picked up at noon from the meeting for worship, rather than from their regular classrooms.

Please remember: All children – infant through rising 5th grade – should always be with an adult. This is important for their safety.

FCNL Advocacy Teams

The FCNL Advocacy Teams of Virginia and Maryland have a letter prepared for signatures, addressed to the senators of each state. The letter urges our senators to support diplomacy, not war, to find a lasting solution to our differences with North Korea. We urge our senators to reassert their co-equal constitutional role over any presidential action that would put our country on the path to war by co-sponsoring S.2047, "Preventing Presumptive War in North Korea of 2017."
