If you are interested, please "register" your child and sign up for your work shift. You can find the Co-op signup sheets in the afternoon and evening program area.

JYM closing worship: On Saturday, we'll close the JYM morning classes with an all-JYM meeting for worship. If weather permits, we'll be outside in the pergola. Last year we had a lovely Meeting for Worship in that beautiful space. Parents are welcome to join us for worship at 11:30.
