Since 1967, Right Sharing of World Resources (RSWR) has embodied the Quaker concern for global inequity. From the beginning, we have recognized that economic justice and spiritual growth are deeply connected. Our work continues to respond to this calling—transforming unjust systems through shared reflection, wealth redistribution, and mutual care. RSWR's two core programs—partnerships with women's groups and reflection on materialism and generosity—are inseparable parts of one movement, each strengthening the other.

Through experiential workshops, curricula, and events, participants reflect on the connections between abundance, scarcity, and simplicity. [In Guatemala, India, Kenya, and Sierra Leone, RSWR partners with women's groups](#) that build personal savings, launch small businesses, collectively manage revolving loan funds, and strengthen women's influence in their communities. In April, RSWR issued its first round of second grants to groups that had previously received funding. These grants strengthen and expand the groups' loan funds, supporting both sustainability and growth for the groups and their members' businesses. This step reflects program shifts made over the past two years, including longer-term partnerships of up to four years and expanded training and support.

In February, RSWR launched [a new website](#) featuring [an events calendar](#) and a centralized space to explore and download [free activities and resources](#). We hope this updated platform helps more communities connect with and use RSWR's offerings. Over the past year, we also welcomed Yasmin Khan as Director of Community Development and Genty Ambeva as a team member in Kenya.

Our staff carry this work forward each day, and supporters like you sustain it. We are deeply grateful for the ways you and your community contribute to building a more just and equitable world.
