

How to Join Hybrid Events on the Annual Session Hub

- 1. Visit: <u>https://www.bym-rsf.org/events/annual-session-2022/</u>
- 2. Click on "<u>Annual Session Hub</u>"
- 3. Enter the name and email address you used to register for Annual Session.
- 4. Check your cell phone and/or email for your Verification Code. If you do not see your Verification Code, be sure to check your Junk or Spam folder. The email will come from Sarah Gillooly.
- 5. Enter your verification code and enter the Hub.
- 6. To join a session, simply scroll down the home screen and click "Join Session." This will automatically open the session in Zoom. *The "Join Session" button will not become visible until <u>5 minutes before the session is scheduled to begin</u>.*
- 7. To add or change a session, simply click the "Add" button next to the session you would like to add to your personalized schedule.

<u>Coffee House</u>: An open-mic talent show for Friends of all ages. Bring your poetry, instrument, hidden talent, Dad jokes, et al. *In-Person Only*

<u>Daily Minute</u>: (our daily news bulletin) is an indispensable source of information about what's happening and where. Listings for Interest groups, special events, and important notices appear here. Make a habit of picking it up from the Information Table or scrolling through the online copy, available on the Annual Session Hub. Submissions may be made to dailyminute@bym-rsf.org or by filling out the form on the Information Table.

<u>Interest Groups</u>: The need for an interest group can evolve quickly, based on issues that come to the business sessions. Check the Daily Minute or the BYM Information Table for the latest information on what Interest Groups are being offered each day. Try one—you might find something new and engaging! If you would like to offer an interest group, write a concise legible description including your name and the desired date and put it in the labeled manila folder on the BYM Information Table by 5:00pm the previous evening. The location of your Interest Group will be printed in the Daily Minute. *In-Person Only*

<u>Junior Yearly Meeting</u>: A complete program is greatly enjoyed by infants to eighth-graders during Annual Session. *In-Person Only*

<u>Meeting for Worship</u>: Annual Session begins with a Meeting for Worship on Tuesday at 2:00pm, followed by the first business session. All of our business sessions are held in a spirit of worship, and Friends are invited to enter the Meeting space online or in-person a few minutes ahead of the appointed time to join in the worship that will have already started there. On First Day (Sunday) morning, the entire community gathers for worship at 9:00am.

<u>Meeting for Business</u>: Meeting for Business, in Rosenstock Hall, Hodson Auditorium, will begin with a reading and a period of silent worship. Copies of the Annual Reports of committees and groups, Interim Meeting Minutes, and other documents are available online on the Annual Session Hub and limited printed copies are located inside the hall. This is core information about what the Yearly Meeting has done in the last year and explains a great deal about what goes on.

All About Annual Session

<u>Workshops</u>: Workshop descriptions can be found online on the Annual Session Hub or in a copy of the Spring Interchange, available at the Information Table. Check the Annual Session Hub to see which workshops you are registered for online (July 26, 28, 31) or in-person (Aug 4-6). To change your registrations, visit the Annual Session Hub or stop by the Information Table.

<u>Worship Sharing and Bible Study</u>: Following breakfast each morning, many Friends begin the day with worship sharing or Bible study in small groups. You may have signed up for an in-person or online section of worship sharing or Bible study during registration, which you can check in the Annual Session Hub. If you are attending in-person, you can also sign up for one of these groups on the sheets near the BYM Information table. We hope that you will feel comfortable for the whole week in your worship sharing group. If your group just doesn't fit, it's fine to ask another group's leader if you may join them.

<u>Young Friends</u>: High school students enjoy a program of activities that intertwine with adult programs at important points. *In-Person Only*

Pre-Arrival Info for In-Person Attendees

Flexible Arrival: If you have pre-registered and have provided completed medical forms for everyone under 18 years of age (and Letters of Understanding for Young Friends), you may check in at any time. Your Welcome Packet, including your room key and building access card if applicable, will be available in a box on the BYM Registration Desk in Whitaker Campus Center.

Arrival Information: If you are not eligible for Flexible Arrival as described above or if you need to make any payments for your stay, you will need to stop by the BYM Registration Desk, located in the lobby of Whitaker Campus Center during the hours listed below. If you arrive at a different time, feel free to join the scheduled adult activities until the next registration time. Children must be separately checked into JYM. Friends arriving after the Registration Desk has closed for the day may call the Registrar at 513-300-9214 for assistance. If you expect to arrive later than 8 pm, please let the Registrar know ahead of time.

Medical Release Forms for Minors: A medical release form is required for each minor child even if they have attended a BYM youth program in the past year. Please print and complete the form, available here, and bring it with you to Annual Session. Blank forms will also be available when you check your child in to JYM. <u>Minors will not be</u> allowed to participate in youth activities without a completed and signed form on file.

Housing Information: All bedrooms have one or two single beds and a matching number of desks, chests of drawers, and closets. Two or three bedrooms are arranged within a semi-suite that shares a bathroom. Each dorm resident will receive: a pillow, a blanket, two sheets, one pillowcase, two towels, and a wash cloth. Rooms are individually air-conditioned. Please Note: If your child(ren) is registered to stay in your room for free, please bring a sleeping bag or cot for your child(ren). Children are generally not assigned their own bed unless you have registered and paid for additional housing.

Other things you may wish to bring: Alarm clock, bath mat, bathrobe, shower shoes, hangers, toiletries, extra pillows/blanket/towel, pillow for sitting, umbrella, laptop for connecting with online participants.

Comfort and Convenience: In August, Frederick tends to be hot and humid in the days but can be cool in the evenings. Friends are encouraged to bring a sweater for comfort and for air-conditioned meeting rooms.

Travel & Parking: Hood College is located at 401 Rosemont Ave, Frederick, MD. Follow signs to Whitaker Campus Center, where you can park and pick up your Welcome Packet and dorm key from the BYM Registration Desk. You may find it helpful to point your GPS directly to: "Whitaker Campus Center, Brodbeck Dr, Federick, MD." During your stay, Friends may park in any of the college parking lots except where specifically restricted by signs. For detailed driving directions or information about public transit options, please contact the BYM Office.

Accessible Transportation: BYM golf cart shuttles are available on routes from the dorms and dining hall to Whitaker Campus Center, Rosenstock Hall, and classroom buildings. A regular golf cart schedule will be posted, and you can request a golf cart by calling or texting Martha Baer: 301-592-7153.

Info for In-Person Attendees

Dormitories

<u>Air Conditioning</u>: All dormitory rooms are individually air conditioned.

<u>Furniture</u>: Beds are all supposed to be at a regular height. If your bed is too high, please see the folks at the registration desk before you make up your bed. All furniture needs to be kept in the room that it occupied when we arrived.

<u>Vending Machines</u>: Soft drink machines are located in the dorms.

<u>Washers & Dryers</u>: Washers and dryers are available in each dorm and may be coin operated or free

<u>Keys and Building Cards</u>: Keys and building cards will be in your Welcome Packet when you arrive on campus. The cards allow access to all secured buildings (dormitories) but are not required for meals. Keys and building cards must be turned in at the BYM Registration Desk in Whitaker Campus Center in the small envelope you received them in. If you forget, you will be charged \$25.00. Please take your name tag holder with you and use at your local Meeting.

Transportation & Accessibility

<u>Parking</u>: Vehicles are allowed to park in any parking lot except where indicated by signs.

<u>Physical Accessibility/On-Campus Shuttle Service</u>: Volunteer drivers provide rides in golf carts for anyone with accessibility needs between dormitories, dining hall, the Whitaker Campus Center, Rosenstock Hall, the Chapel, and classroom buildings. All buildings have basic ADA accessibility, but accessible entrances may be inconvenient in some of the older buildings.

<u>BYM Bookstore</u>: Books, crafts, clothes and more! Located in the Commons Room in the Whitaker Campus Center, the Bookstore is open Tuesday to Saturday. Specific hours are printed in the Daily Minute, and browsing is possible anytime the doors are open.

<u>Table Displays & Meeting Timelines</u>: Displays about Quaker organizations and BYM Monthly Meeting anniversary timelines are found on the first floor of Whitaker Campus Center and inside the Commons Room.

<u>BYM Office</u>: is located in the Commuter Student Lounge on the second floor of Whitaker Campus Center. Hours are 8:30-9:30am, 1:30-3pm and 9-11pm. The phone number is 301-774-7663.

<u>College Bookstore</u>: is located in the Whitaker Campus Center. Hoodies, snacks, and personal items can be purchased here.

<u>Internet Access</u>: Wireless access is available in all the public buildings and in the dorms. The password can be found at the Information Desk and in the Daily Minute.

<u>BYM Information Tables</u>: The Annual Session Information tables in Whitaker Campus Center provide abundant information. They tell you where worship sharing groups, Bible Study, workshops, and interest groups meet. Whenever possible, a real live person will be there to help you! Tables inside the plenary meeting room will have business meeting documents, which are also available on the Annual Session Hub.

Covid Policy & Procedures

BYM Annual Session Covid Policies are subject to change based on local, state, and national conditions. We hope conditions will improve by August, which may allow us to relax some policies. Any changes to the policy will be shared with registered participants via email.

- 1. Friends are kindly asked to take a rapid Covid test before checking in at Annual Session.
- 2. Masking protocols will prioritize safety over comfort. Friends who attend will need to be comfortable wearing masks in certain situations. No Friend will be asked to *not* wear a mask if they are not comfortable doing so. Masking protocols are as follows:
 - a. Masks will be worn by Friends while passing and mingling in indoor, public spaces such as the registration area, bookstore, dorm lobbies, etc.
 - b. Masks will be worn for all indoor sessions with more than 20 Friends in attendance including all plenaries, Meetings for Worship, and business sessions. However, a small number of Friends will be unmasked during these events such as the Clerks, plenary speaker, etc. Friends will also be asked to briefly remove their mask when delivering a message.
 - c. For smaller indoor gatherings, Friends should expect to wear a mask. However, the group may unanimously choose to be unmasked.
 - d. Masks will not be required at outdoor events and gatherings.
 - e. Masks will not be worn during meals. There is some outdoor seating available on the patio of the Hood College dining hall. In addition, Friends should be aware that Hood College staff and other on-campus guests will be following local masking regulations, which may include not wearing masks at the time of Annual Session. <u>Hood College's Covid-19 policies can be found here</u>.
- 3. BYM will have a limited number of rapid Covid tests on-hand at Annual Session but cannot guarantee their availability for all. Friends are encouraged to bring a rapid test with them in the event they begin to feel unwell or if there is a need to test due to reported exposure.
- 4. In the event a Friend feels unwell, we ask them to test, either with a self-administered rapid test or through local medical care. BYM will maintain a list of urgent care providers offering PCR tests. Please call or text the General Secretary immediately at 301-658-3379 if you have a positive result. Every effort will be made to keep your information private while also protecting the community.
- 5. Annual Session and its participants will abide by any public health recommendations made by the Frederick County Department of Public Health that exceed the BYM Annual Session Covid Policy detailed above up to and including cancellation of in-person Annual Session activities.

The Annual Session Covid Policies are subject to revision by the BYM Program Committee and General Secretary. Any revisions will be shared with all registered participants in advance. Young Friends and Junior Yearly Meeting may opt for their own Covid policies, which will be communicated to all participants and their parents.

Your participation, and the participation of any minor children under your care, is voluntary. While the precautions above will be followed and enforced, BYM cannot guarantee that Friends will not be exposed to the SARs Covid-19 virus or other illnesses.

Friendly Agreements for Annual Session

Note: All participants in Annual Session have signed and agreed to abide by BYM's Annual Session Expectations as part of registration.

At Baltimore Yearly Meeting, we are a community of Friends living in the discipline of the Spirit. Attenders of all ages are asked to observe conduct appropriate to Friends' principles and to take care that all of their personal behavior is bound by a respect for all, including those of the host community.

As a Religious Society, we profess a belief that God endows each human being with a measure of the Divine Spirit. (Faith and Practice, 1988) We will not permit violent physical, verbal, or other behavior that we find, through corporate discernment, violates that Divine Spirit. Those in our midst whose behavior disrupts program activities and/or threatens the physical and emotional safety and integrity of another will be asked to leave.

Parents and sponsors are expected to be actively responsible for their children at all times. Attenders are asked to help make a safe and supportive community for all children. The <u>BYM Youth Safety Policy</u> will be in effect, and all Friends are asked to be familiar with it. The policy can be found in the BYM Yearbook online or by stopping by the Annual Session Registration Desk.

If unable to function within the guidelines of the community, any attender may be asked to leave. Alcohol, illegal drugs, and tobacco products (including vaping) are not permitted at Annual Session.

Refund Policy

If you cannot attend Annual Session and want a refund, your request must be received by July 15. Your registration fees, minus a \$25 service charge, will be refunded as soon as possible after Annual Session.

In the event in-person Annual Session must be canceled due to Covid conditions, the refund policy will be communicated to all participants. It is our intent that all participants will have their fees fully refunded in the event of such cancelation. However, this will depend on the flexibility of Hood College in delaying their contract with BYM.
